

SJHE 2023 Winter Ball Dress Code

This is a Catholic sponsored event. We expect clothing and behavior to comply with the virtues taught by the Church and to show respect for your fellow peers, your parents, our chaperones, and priests.

Modesty is admittedly a subjective interpretation, but one which we have a duty to uphold. Attendees should therefore err on the side of modesty so as to not place chaperones in the difficult position of upholding our dress code standards. We expect nothing less than full cooperation from attendees and parents/guardians on this issue. We (the chaperones) reserve the right to determine whether an attendee's attire does/does not fully comply with the dress code.

BOYS Formal Dance Attire

Must wear a button down dress shirt that has a collar, tie or bow-tie, dress pants (no jeans, denim, shorts or cargos), belt, and dress shoes with dress socks.

- Jackets optional, and shirts must be tucked in at all times
- Ties must be worn properly at all times
- No hats

GIRLS Formal Dance Attire

Must wear ball gown length (floor length) or tea length (middle of the knee or longer). Shoes should be ballet flats or heels, no athletic shoes.

- Dresses must be middle of the knee or longer, to include slits.
- Neckline of dress must be cut in a modest way without showing cleavage. No strapless, off the shoulder, halter, or dresses with spaghetti straps.
- Backs covered to no lower than shoulder blades or traditional undergarment strap
- Modest cut outs allowed if they follow all other tenants of the dress code (no cleavage showing, no abdomen or back below shoulder blades exposed)
- No transparent fabrics--laces, nets, organdy, nylons, etc.--unless sufficient backing is added (opaque skirts with overlay must meet knee length and upper garment guidelines)
- No visible undergarments
- For flouncy or swingy knee length dresses, long shorts are required to be worn underneath

Not to Code? SJHE has a bin of cover-up items for those dancers who have not adhered to the above dress code. We know that our cover-up items might not be as stylish or cute as your teen's original outfit. Your teen can avoid this situation by carefully following the Dress Code!

Advance Approval Preferred: We highly recommend and **prefer** that teens email us a picture of themselves in their attire ahead of the dance. This will help avoid any uncomfortable situations on the day of the dance if their attire is not to code. Please send those pictures (front and back) to sjhedances@gmail.com .
